After a pause in our construction operations we reopened our construction sites in full compliance with government guidelines. 
Our sites and premises implement the BAM COVID operating procedures alongside implementing the Construction Leadership Councils (CLC) Site Operating Procedures (SOP) and the UK Government and devolved Government guidance applicable to the specific setting.

We have risk assessed every one of our construction sites FM locations and premises and modified or curtailed activities accordingly to ensure that no work is undertaken unless we are able to fully comply with the requirements. These risk assessments are under constant review together with our COVID operating procedures and guidance and are communicated through our management structures to all staff alongside publication on our COVID specific area of our Intranet.

### **Staying COVID-19 secure**

BAM confirm that we have complied with the UK and devolved governments' guidance on managing the risk of COVID-19:

- We have carried out a COVID-19 risk assessment and shared the results with the people who work here
- We have cleaning, handwashing and hygiene procedures in line with guidance
- We have taken all reasonable steps to help people work from home
- We have taken all reasonable steps to maintain a 2m distance in the workplace
- Where people cannot be 2m apart, we have done everything practical to manage transmission risk
